Road to a New Life Starts Here

Abandoned by her dad, but not by her Father!

The day he was paid, and a day before the rent was due, Ashley's stepfather abandoned Ashley, her sister Holly and their mom.



He left the girls with no roof over their heads and nowhere to go. "Nobody would take us in," Ashley remembers. "My best friend John and his mom let us stay with them for a week, but the landlord said we couldn't stay any longer."

The night the family left John's house, **they ended up sleeping on the streets of Longview**. Ashley says it was "scary" because you don't know what kind of people are out there. But her mom was brave. "She stayed awake all night and let me sleep." The next day, the family found a home at Hiway 80 Rescue Mission's Women & Family Shelter. Here, they had their own room, a place to sleep and be together. The girls began attending Bible study classes, and Ashley soon realized that instead of punishing her, **God loved and cared for her and wanted her to "do something" with her life**.

Within a month, Ashley was back in school – even though she hadn't wanted to go.

Ashley's mom is working hard, too. She's graduated from our New Creation Program and is studying to get her GED. Her next step will be to find a job and then, move the family into their own home.

Ashley's excited about the family having a place of their own again, but she's committed to coming back to visit her Mission family and volunteer and help with "the little kids."

"This is an amazing place," she says. "A place where people can come to get back on their feet."
