"I was" lost soul"

Cliff's dad was a champion rodeo rider – and left the family when Cliff was a kid. Growing up without a dad was tough, and Cliff started living a wild life at a young age.

He settled down when he met his wife. But after 15 years of marriage and the birth of their daughter, things fell apart. "I turned to drugs and ended up destroying my life," Cliff says. "I was lost, going from job to job and using drugs to cope."

It all led to the day where Cliff sat in his car, wondering if there was anything left to live for. "I was totally broken, looking at what I'd let myself become. I told the Lord, if this is the rest of my life, I'd rather just check out."

But God wasn't finished with Cliff, and sitting in that driveway, Cliff remembered his pastor in Kilgore telling him about the Mission. "I just started driving...and the Lord led me here."

It wasn't easy for Cliff. "Coming here was nerve wracking. I was a lost soul, very angry and bitter," he says. "I'd basically thrown my life away."

Cliff only planned to stay until he found work as an electrician or truck driver. But after a month, he realized that "God wanted me in the program here."

Since joining our long-term New Creation Program, Cliff has not only found freedom from his addiction... he's also grown spiritually. "I saw that I had nothing without God," he says. "It's by His grace that I'm here today, and not in prison or dead."

Cliff has worked hard on rebuilding his relationship with his daughter. "She means the world to me, and I'm listening to God, working to be the dad He's always meant for me to be."

As he looks toward the future, Cliff is full of hope. "I'm so grateful—God and the Mission have made all the difference in my life," he says. "I want to encourage people to keeping giving because they really do help more people than you can imagine. They've changed my life."

From Black Sheep to Chosen Child

Tawnya's childhood was filled with upheaval and uncertainty. "My dad was in the Air Force, so we moved around a lot," she says. "I knew my dad loved me, but always wondered about my mom. She always treated me differently than my sisters and brother.

To my mom, I was the black sheep."

Though Tawnya accepted Christ as her savior at the age of nine, it wasn't long before she was making self-destructive choices. "I thought my way was the only way to go," she says. "I cried out to God when trouble came, but then went back to doing things my way."

She experimented with drugs, and was an unwed mother of twins by the age of 15, raising her sons alone. Eventually, Tawnya found herself in an abusive relationship. "I left a couple of times, but always went back, and the abuse kept getting worse," she says. "I really started believing I wasn't good for anything or anyone."

Yet, when her boyfriend was away, Tawnya would take out her Bible and read the Word of God. "I knew I could no longer do it on my own and cried out to God, 'Lead me to where I need to go and do with me what Your will is," she says. "That's when I ended up at Hiway 80 Rescue Mission."

Though Tawnya was frightened, the moment she walked through the Mission's front door, her fear went away. "I felt a peace come over me. At that point, I knew God had me," she says.

Tawnya joined the Mission's New Creation Program at the Women & Family Shelter, participating in Bible studies, life-skills classes and work therapy. "At times, it was hard with all the homework and chores...but I wouldn't take it back for anything," she says. "I have always wanted to learn more about the Bible and about God. That has been possible here. God knows our hearts. He knows what I have always longed for."

Since coming to the Mission,
Tawnya's life has been transformed.
"When I decided to let God lead my
life, wow, what a change! I have
purpose, and the neat thing is that
God chose me. I love that," she says.
"As Philippians 4:13 says, 'I can do all
things through Christ who strengthens
me.' And, with that, every day is like
another little venture God has me on."
