

You Helped Andrew Build a New Life

"We grew up poor, so we just went from place to place," Andrew says of his childhood. He had never known his father, and his mother abused drugs. The only stability he found was with his grandmother, but as he grew older and began getting into trouble, she couldn't handle him anymore.

Then, at 13, Andrew began using drugs himself. "I just grew up fast," he says. His mother took him out of high school at 16 and enrolled him in a trade school. When he was 18, she sent him to Arizona to live with the father he had never met. "He was a meth dealer. I got hooked on meth my first day there." Eventually, father and son argued and Andrew was on the street, stranded in Arizona. He briefly got clean in a sober living house, but when he came to Texas, he relapsed.

In the following years, Andrew fathered three children, now ten, five and four. But he wasn't able to give them any more of a stable childhood than he had had himself. When he split up with the mother of his youngest child, his life hit a new low. He got deeper into his addiction to meth and attempted suicide. After seven days in detox, Andrew came to Hiway 80 on New Year's Day 2020 and joined the New Creation Discipleship Recovery Program.

"This is a really good place," Andrew says. "There are positive people here. They give me hope. They helped me get to know myself and see what I'm capable of. I got my confidence back. Recovery is a whole process of building something from the ground up."

Recently graduated from the program, Andrew is still building his new life. He is looking for a job, and hopes to save enough for a car and a place of his own. He is working on restoring relationships with his children. Most importantly, Andrew got baptized and gave his life to Jesus.

When you give to Hiway 80, Andrew says, "You're doing a good thing, and you really help people. Even if they don't graduate from the program, you feed them and give them shelter. Everything counts!"
